Austin's Haunted Pizza

First open as a general store in 1879, the Austin Pizza Garden in Oak Hill has been a post office, masonic lodge and art gallery. The store was owned and operated by Texas Ranger James Andrew Patton in what was then Oatmanville. Rosa Patton later inherited the store and married Texas Ranger John Dudley White who is believed to be the ghost that haunts the building to this day. Many employees have had encounters with the ghost over the years where lights turn on and doors open on their own. On December 27, 1839 the city of Austin was officially incorporated. Originally named Waterloo, the name changed in August in honor of Stephen F. Austin. Soon to be 180 years, once a small town and now a large bustling city.

- 1888- Capitol building completed
- 1918- Andrew Zilker donated the land to AISD who sold it to the city
- 1950's-Think tanks and research labs were founded and Austin began its Tech future
- 1970's-Rapid growth contributed to increased political activity and concerns over water protection
- 1970's-Willie Nelson and David Rodriguez ushered in music rebirth and helped begin the "Music Capital of the World" era
- 1980's-Traffic is now one of the most talked about subjects and hardest to overcome
- 1990's-City adopted "Silicon Hills" as its new nickname due to the influx of technology companies
- 2000's-Keep Austin Weird became THE slogan

Now, we only have memories of Austin Aqua Fest, La Zona Rosa, Leslie Cochran, Highland Mall, Holiday House, Armadillo World Headquarters, Dinosaurs Alive......the list goes on. May this century be as good to Austin as all those we remember.
